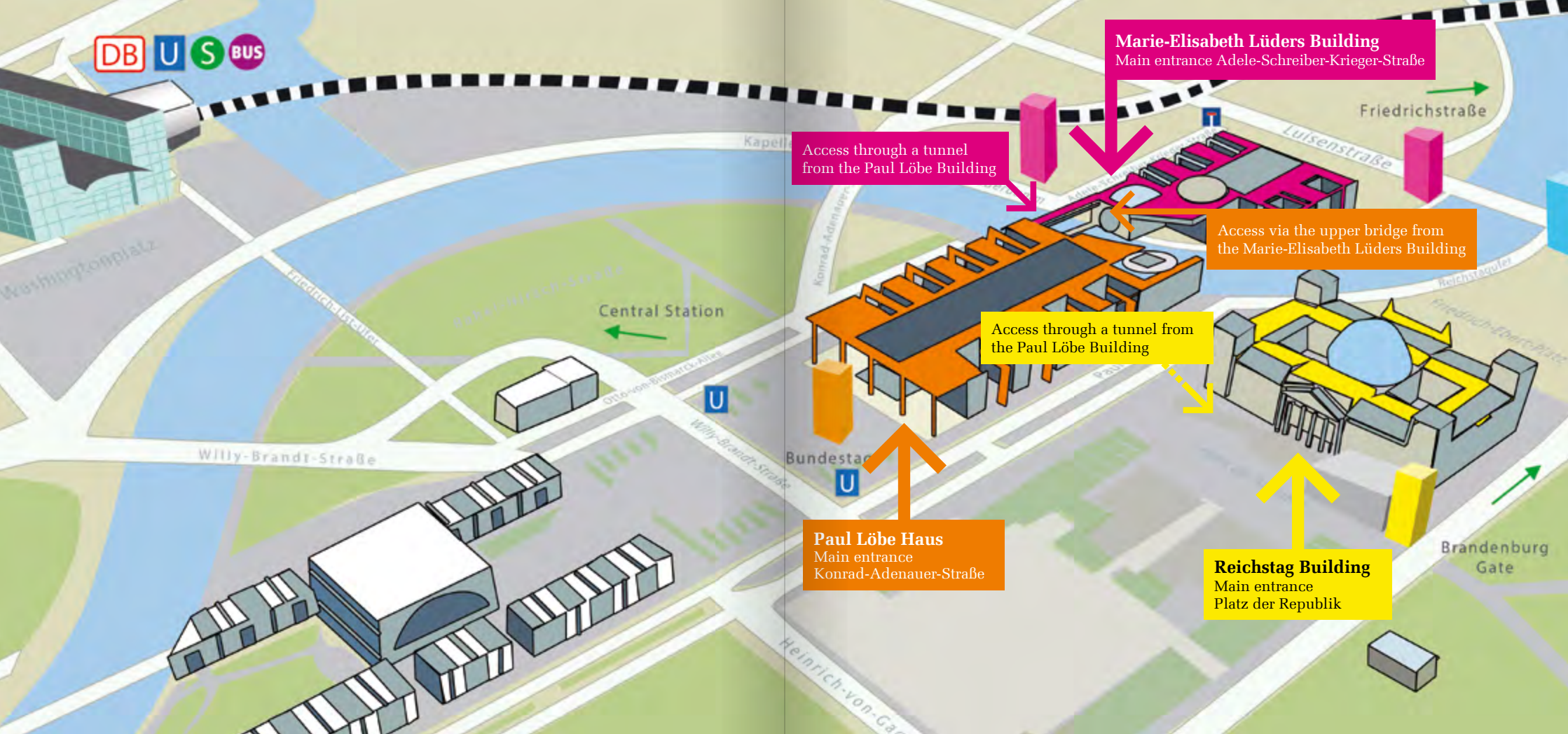

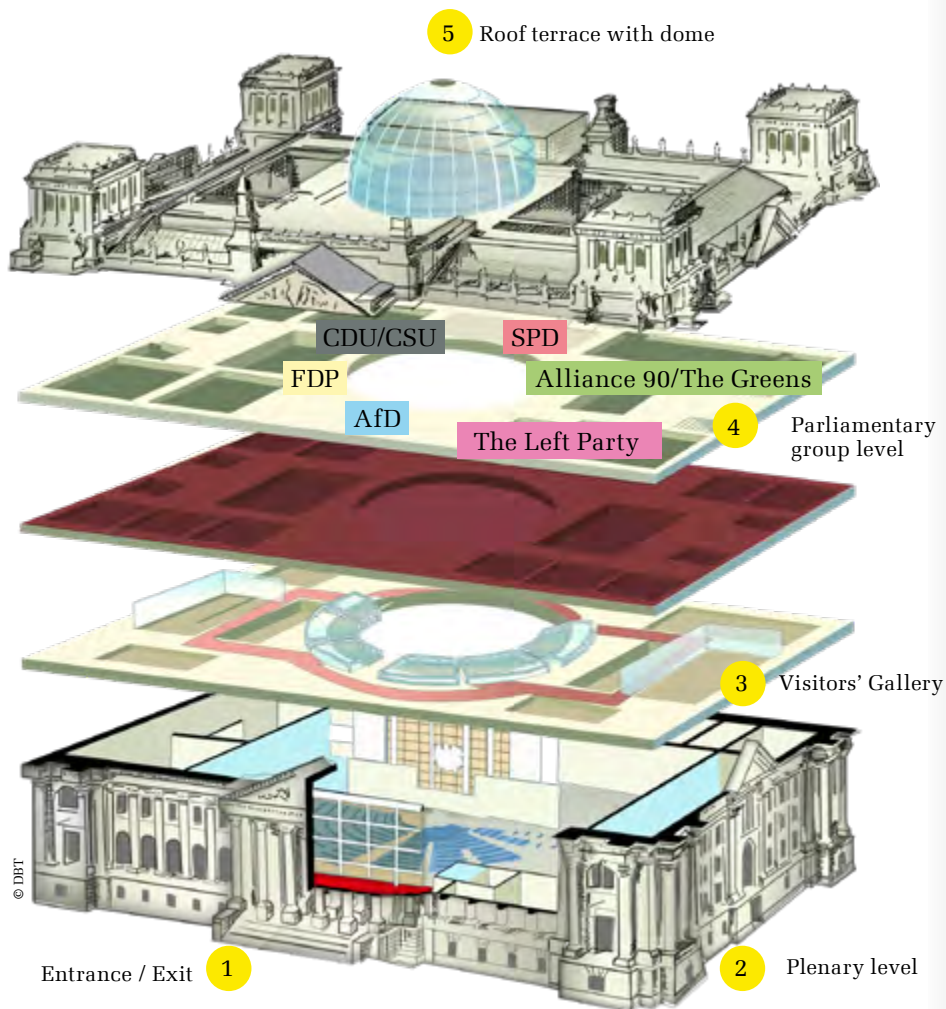


Map
