Key questions for the experts

Afghan civil society perspective

Ms Zarifa Ghafari (NGO "Assistance and Promotion of Afghan Women")

- Which projects for women's rights and for the promotion of women at local level did you deem to be especially valuable?
- How has the gradual roll back of international engagement affected the women in Afghanistan?
- O How did the international engagement over 20 years affect the young generation in Afghanistan in particular? Which factors have hampered the sustainable formation of an open and liberal society?
- What were the challenges you faced as the mayor of Maidan Shahr in offering services to the general public? Was international support helpful in that respect, and if so, in what way?
- Was there a realistic chance to successfully combat corruption in Afghanistan during the period between 2015 and 2021? What was the main focus of the German engagement during that time?
