Dear guests,

Parliaments need room for their work. And in the German Bundestag there are many rooms: meeting rooms for the parliamentary groups and committees, a protocol room and a large meeting room known as the *Europasaal*, reception rooms, rooms for exhibitions, and of course at the heart of the Reichstag Building, our biggest room: the plenary chamber. What is perhaps less well known is that there was once a very different type of room in the Reichstag Building: a delivery room, during the Second World War! Between 1943 and 1945, around 80 babies came into the world at the maternity unit in the building's air-raid shelter: they were dubbed the *Reichstagskinder*".

Welcome to the German Bundestag's Open Day

I warmly invite you to delve into our multifaceted and fascinating world of parliamentarianism and its eventful history. Visit the glass dome – a magnet for many visitors from all over the world. The dome has become a symbol of our nation's capital and its architecture makes our parliamentary democracy's aspiration of transparency visible to all. The imposing 360-degree view of Berlin's political district makes the visit more than worth your while.

And yet there's much more to discover at our Open Day. You can look over Members' shoulders, follow panel discussions, experience readings by prominent writers such as Katja Petrowskaja and Simon Schwartz, or find out from the staff of the Administration of the Bundestag everything you always wanted to know about how Parliament operates: why, for example, often only some of the Members of the Bundestag are in the plenary chamber, what exactly the

German word "*Hammelsprung*" refers to or just how swift the parliamentary shorthand writers need to be to create the minutes of plenary sittings (including all interjections!). Also on offer are tours of the buildings (including one focusing on building technology), a "*hot wire*" game, a poetry slam and the launch of a competition for school pupils: "*75 years of the Bundestag and 175 years of St Paul's Church*".

Those who are unable to join us in Berlin can still enjoy several programme points. As was the case last year, livestreams and videos on demand are available for many of the events on offer.

Our democracy lives and breathes from the exchange between Members of the Bundestag and citizens. The Open Day has an important role to play in this respect. I hope that a great many of you will accept our invitation and wish you an interesting time visiting the "*heart of democracy*".

- Please carry an ID card or another form of photo identification with you.

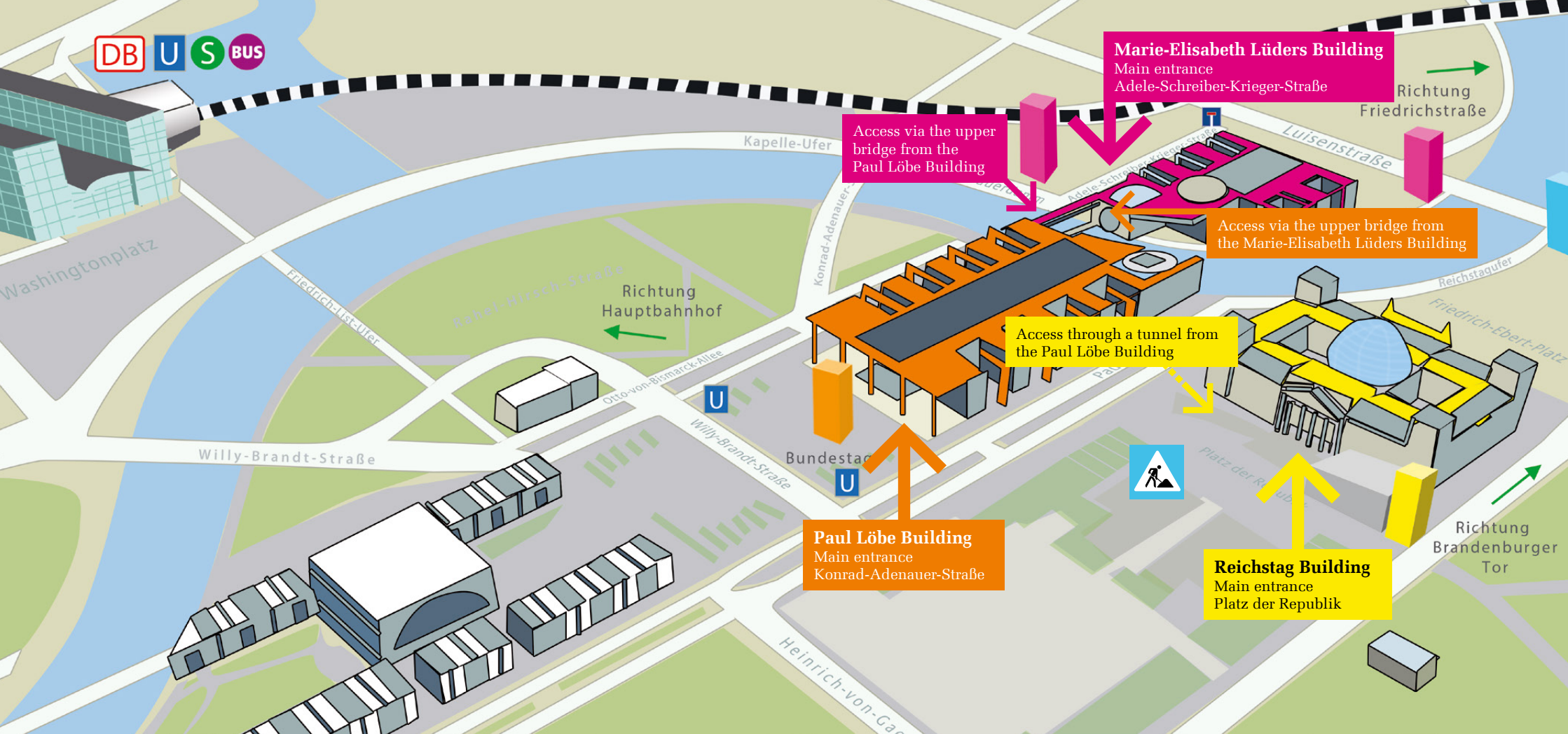

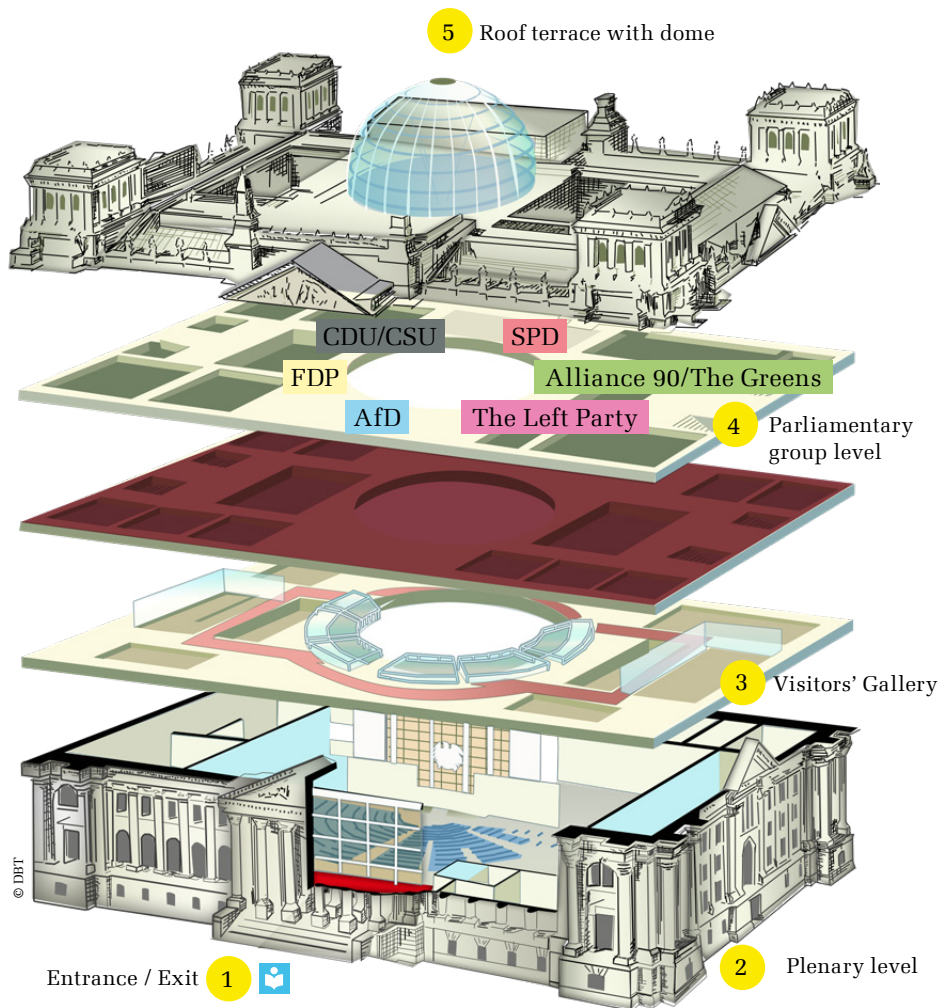
