During the battle for Borodyanka, Russian forces bombed targets from the air, including eight multi-storey apartment blocks, and shot and killed civilians. According to the police, by May 2022, 41 bodies had been found under the rubble in the town, and inhabitants had buried more than 300 additional bodies in graves.

Visiting the exhibition

The exhibition will be on display from 20 to 29 September 2023 in the German Bundestag. It will be open to visitors from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and from 2:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Monday to Friday, except on 29 September 2023, when it will be closed in the afternoon.

Visitors must register by email at least two days before the date they wish to visit. To register, send an email to ausstellungen@bundestag.de.

Please note:

There will be three sets of virtual reality glasses available for each of the 20-minute time slots at the exhibition.

When registering, visitors must provide the specific time of their visit as well as the desired date: for example, 9:20 a.m., 9:40 a.m., or 10:00 a.m. The registration email must include visitors' full name (first and surname), date of birth, and a telephone number where they can be contacted.

Access to the exhibition is through the west entrance to the Paul Löbe Building, Konrad-Adenauer-Str. 1, 10557 Berlin. Please report to staff at the West Portal 15 minutes before your visit is due to start to allow enough time for access controls.
